Topic: Workface Planning: Killing the Monster

Abstract: There are several mega-projects continuing to be impacted by late schedules and over-budget results, the majority of these issues occur during construction, where productivity has become a major concern. Productivity improvement is key in securing construction results and one of the most important component is workface planning. However, there is a lack of commitment in workface planning throughout the industry, It is overlooked as a big monster very difficult to implement. But this is wrong, workface planning is nothing strange to project standards and involves small amount of modifications in the usual project execution plan. Workface planning must be used in every mega-project. Major objectives of workface planning are:

- Correct Project Set-up
- Early Construction involvement
- Construction oriented engineering design
- High Construction involvement in Planning
